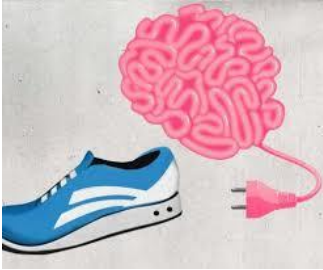
- They will collate a class contact sheet that can be used by parents to contact each other about social events, parties and playdates etc.

Parent coordinators do not deal with any issues or difficulties that are associated with individual children these should be shared by parents directly with class teachers which is very well understood and adhered to by parents.

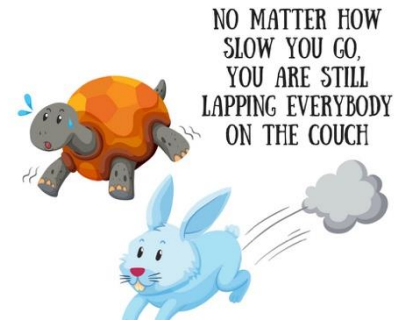
Coordinators will always share information by e mail and will not be responsible for any What's App communications.

What should I do?

Children aged two and three years old are offered this vaccination in general practice. Your child's GP surgery should contact you. If you haven't heard from their GP by early November, contact them directly to make an appointment.

Children in reception class and school years 1, 2, 3 & 4 will be offered the vaccine at school. Your child's school will provide details from the local healthcare team.

Breakfast Club

Breakfast Club operates on the Sedding Street building from 8am. It is open to all children from Nursery to Year 6 and costs just £1.50 per child each day. Breakfast is served until 8:25am.

Breakfast Menu:

During breakfast club, children can play different games, and at 8.30am all equipment is tidied away. KS2 children then make their way to Mr Phillips for playground activities, while children in Nursery, Reception and KS1 are escorted to Cadogan Gardens at 8:45am. They have a supervised playtime in the playground until they start school at 9am.
